## At Our Last Meeting: Wood Glues with Titebond

Last month Grady Barrett, an independent sales representative for Franklin, visited the Guild to talk about Titebond wood glues. Grady started off his presentation discussing hide glue, which was what got the whole thing started for the company in 1935.

In 1952, Titebond began making what is now called the "original" formula of PVA (polyvinyl acetate) glue. It was a big advance over hide glue because it cleaned up with water and didn't need to be heated up to be used. It is still widely used today for interior applications. Through the years, Titebond has introduced other advances including Titebond 2 and Titebond 3, which are water-resistant and waterproof, even though they clean up with water before they are dry.


